Welcome to cAIR10

Welcome to the first conference on Applied Interculturality Research. Location. All events will take place in *ReSoWi*, Section C, ground floor unless otherwise indicated. *ReSoWi* is a long modern building in a street called *Geidorfgürtel*. It marks the northern edge of the main campus of Uni Graz. The main entrance is near the middle of the building. All plenary sessions will take place in a lecture hall with raked seating (we are calling it “Room 1”). All parallel sessions and workshops are in adjacent seminar rooms (2 and 3). Lunches will be served a few meters away in a restaurant on the first floor.

Conference etiquette. We have two special (if rather dull) requests.

- Time: To ensure that all speakers get all the program time that we have promised them, and that audience members can plan their time and change rooms during parallel sessions, we will run the conference exactly and relentlessly to schedule (\pm 1 minute!). We ask all presenters and chairs to observe the timetable strictly.
- Space: In Room 1, please sit near the middle of each row, to avoid blocking empty seats. Latecomers should be able to sit down without interrupting the speaker.

Internet. If you need internet during the conference, there are two options. 1. Enter username 10t000pa, password cair10 and select BZEDVZ at any computer terminal in the University of Graz (e.g. downstairs on the left as you enter the building). 2. Connect to free wireless LAN with your laptop at the conference venue (ReSoWi, section C ground floor).

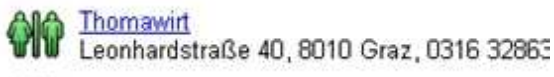
